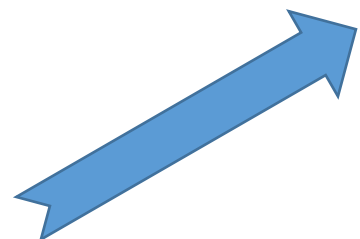
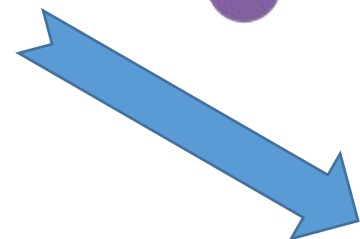

# A research team's experiences of working remotely

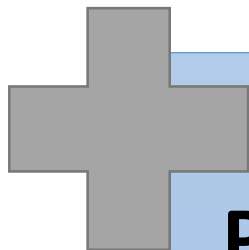
## Why:

- Recognised opportunity to introduce more flexibility for team
- Risk-assessed to ensure all work could be carried out remotely
- Discussed internally prior to implementing pilot phase

## How:

- All members of team permitted to work remotely twice per month
- Contactable to wider team (web app / Skype)
- Tasks are equivalent to an office-based

- Reduction in commute time
