


Green-new-deal-3.0

Pathways for a collective climatic intelligence

Friday 30th October ('30-10-20') – 1400-1530 (UK time)

The Green New Deal is based on a clear logic – to combine the low carbon transition with economic prosperity and social justice, in the face of climatic 'Apocalypse Soon'. But in reality there are endless barriers & conflicts – technologies, infrastructures, markets, social norms and political agendas, to name a few (and the pandemic has not made it easier).

For such problems of *deeper complexity*, it seems we can use the insights of <u>Deeper-City</u> on a 'collective green intelligence', to help turn crisis into opportunity. This opening session focuses on one angle – the circular economy or *circul-onomics*. We aim to set the scope, explore the potential and map out some next steps.


