Pathways for a local collaborative governance

Many voted to 'take back control' – but what and where is this control? And if the local is the priority what does this mean in an age of global networks and mobility? We need to rethink what is government / governance, and how can it enable / disable local collaboration and synergy?

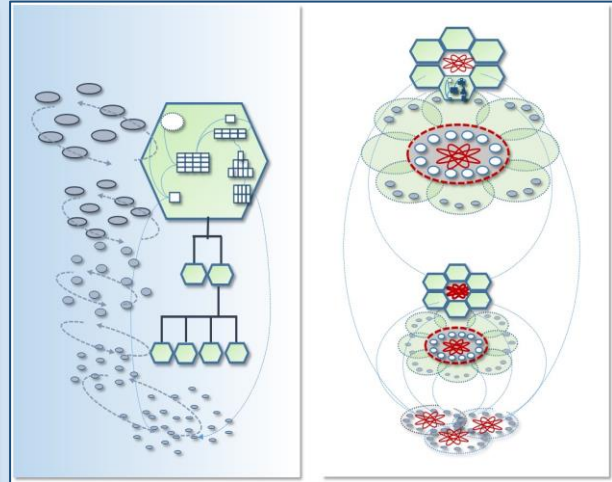
